

## 2014 APPLICATION

By assisting young people from farm backgrounds in their pursuit of a college or university education in agriculture, we are investing in their future careers – and in the future of the agriculture industry in Canada.

The Monsanto Fund Opportunity Scholarship Program is available to Canadian high school students from family farms who are enrolled in their final year of high school as of May 30, 2014 and eligible to graduate from high school in 2014. Those eligible for a scholarship must be planning to enroll at a Canadian post-secondary institution (degree or diploma) in a first-year agriculture program.

If you have applied for entry into a college or university, but have not yet been accepted, you can still apply for a Monsanto Fund Opportunity Scholarship. However, if you are awarded a scholarship, you must provide an acceptance letter from your educational institution.

Successful applicants will each be awarded a scholarship valued at \$1,500, based on demonstrated academic standards and leadership in the community. Selection will be made by an independent panel.
